



Cuban Public Health & Healthcare Up Close March 13 - 20, 2016

A People-to-People Educational Exchange in Cuba for Alumni of the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health Organized by Medical Education Cooperation with Cuba (MEDICC)



Travel authorized under the January 2015 provisions of the General License for travel to Cuba of the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC), U.S. Treasury Department.

Travel services provided by Marazul Charters, Inc., a licensed travel service provider.

Medical Education Cooperation with Cuba (MEDICC) invites alumni of the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health to participate in a special 7-day people-to-people travel exchange focusing on the Cuban national health system, which produces health status measures comparable to those of developed countries -- at a fraction of the cost. The exchange will highlight elements of the Cuban system that are applicable to U.S. settings, including emphasis on prevention; care delivery that combines public health and clinical medicine; neighborhood-based access to care; robust health data collection and analysis; and active community engagement. Travelers will participate in a full-time schedule of activities during the exchange, and will have many opportunities to get to know Cubans in the settings where they live and work.

The program will be designed according to participants' interests, and may include the following site visits, exchanges, and activities:

- Consultorios (neighborhood doctor-nurse offices), policlínicos (multi-service secondary-level clinics), and hospitals to understand Cuba's primary, secondary, and tertiary health care delivery sites.
- Exchanges with members of community and neighborhood organizations promoting health for Cubans of all ages
- Exchanges with residents of maternity homes and/or senior centers
- Visits to specialized medical centers for the management of chronic diseases such as diabetes
- Site visits and exchanges in both Havana and provincial areas
- An exchange with U.S. students of Cuba's Latin American Medical School (ELAM)
- Participant-only discussions with experienced MEDICC Staff to reflect on the implications of the Cuban health system for outcomes in the US.





Registration:

This educational exchange will accommodate a maximum of 32 people (divided into two groups of 16). Two Harvard Chan School staff, and a MEDICC representative will accompany each group. MEDICC will collect essential travel information and poll participants about their interests via the online application form, and the Harvard Chan School may arrange the groups to best match participant interests. Applications will be accepted on a first come, first served basis and we expect that the trip will fill to capacity quickly. No deposit is due at the time of application but MEDICC will contact you shortly after registration is complete to request a \$500 deposit, which will be fully refundable until January 1, 2016. Travel arrangements and costs:

Once you have applied to and been accepted for the exchange, you will sign a Participation Agreement, and send MEDICC a \$500 deposit to guarantee your place. Participants make their own domestic flight arrangements to Miami, as well as their own overnight arrangements there, if needed. The total cost for a one-week program varies depending on the number of participants, hotel and ground transportation costs, but will be around \$4,500-\$5,000 depending on accommodations selected (see below for description of options). Marazul Charters will inform you of the final cost and invoice you closer to your travel date.

Cost estimate includes:

- Pre-trip orientation webinars, detailed travel advice, and a packet of relevant readings
- Roundtrip airfare between Miami and Havana
- Lodging for seven nights, all breakfasts and weekday lunches—5 nights in Havana and 2 nights in Matanzas province
- Legal travel fully authorized under the U.S. Treasury Department/OFAC General License
- Full-time program of educational exchanges tailored to the group's expressed interests
- Ground transportation in Cuba for all program activities
- A MEDICC expert and a specialized medical interpreter to facilitate your communication with the many Cubans you'll meet on the exchange
- Cuban visa and health insurance to cover you while in Cuba

Cost estimate does not include:

- Domestic airfare to/from Miami and accommodations in Miami
- Dinners
- Incidentals such as taxis, bottled water, telephone/internet fees, tips
- Optional activities and expenses





Important notes:

A passport valid through 9/20/2016 is required; if your passport expires before then, please renew early, or your Cuban visa may not be processed on time. Spouses and companions of primary travelers may attend the program. In order to be eligible, they must complete a separate application form, pay separate fees, and participate in all the official activities of the exchange. Travel companions of primary travelers should have experience in public health or health care delivery or at least a deep interest in these topics. To ensure the maximum number of Harvard Chan alumni who can experience this unique opportunity, we ask that each primary traveler only register a maximum of one travel companion.

Travelers <u>must arrive in Miami on Saturday, March 12</u>. Return flights from Havana to Miami frequently experience delays, and it is suggested that travelers also plan to spend Sunday, March 20 in Miami to avoid missing connections. MEDICC and Marazul will strive to arrange a charter itinerary that allows for a same-day departure to travelers' home cities, but cannot guarantee this itinerary until 45-60 days before departure. The Harvard Chan School plans to arrange a first night meet-and-greet in Miami prior to departure. Time and location will be announced shortly after registration closes, and in plenty of time to book your flight to Miami. MEDICC also expects to organize welcome and farewell dinners in Havana, with both groups together, on March 13 and March 19.

Options for accommodations in Cuba: MEDICC and Marazul have reserved accommodations for participants in the Melia Cohiba (5 stars), the Hotel Presidente (4 stars), and rooms in private homes in the Vedado and Nuevo Vedado neighborhoods (casas particulares—3-4 stars). Participants may choose single or double rooms, and will indicate their choice when registering. Accommodations options are subject to availability.
